# 5. Fire Fighting Measures

## 6. Accidental Release Measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

Prevent entry into waterways, sewer, basements or confined areas. Cover with plastic sheet to prevent spreading. Absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers.
